## Redfield Clinic News

Redfield's medical care is threatened by Iowa legislative proposals: The home town medical care provided by rural medical clinics staffed by PAs like Redfield's is endangered by legislative proposals to put PAs under the Iowa medical board again. The medical board has long been opposed to the PA-physician team way of providing health care in Iowa's small towns. Among other barriers to care the medical board has proposed regulations that would prevent care from being provided by a PA if the physician was more than 30 minutes away from the clinic. The medical board has opposed virtually all of the legislative improvements that allowed small town clinics like Redfield's to re-open as a PA staffed medical clinic after it was closed by the previous owner in 1988. Those improvements include PA prescribing, drug dispensing and requiring insurance coverage for medical care provided by PAs.

For the past 28 years a board composed of PAs, physicians and public members have regulated PAs, successfully protecting the public and treating PAs fairly. Both the PA and medical board agree that there has been no upswing in PA problems. Yet, after the PA board voted to ease PA regulations while keeping both the doctor and PA responsible for the care provided, a few legislators began promoting more restrictive regulation. Additionally, they would eliminate the PA board while putting PAs under a board with no PAs on it, the medical board. One former medical board representative commented in the past "If they can come to Des Moines for their prom dresses, they can come to Des Moines for their medical care."

To prevent the end of Redfield's 30 years of small town medical care please contact your state legislators and the Committee Chair that has the bills to put PA regulation under a board opposed to PAs. Ask them to help keep care in Redfield by opposing bills to fix something that isn't broken by putting PAs under the medical board again (HF 2041 and HF 2105). And ask them to oppose rules to make it more expensive to provide care, and threaten small town health care with over regulation like the proposed additional PA regulations. Let them know how you feel about your local medical care.
