## The Raccoon River Valley Trail at the Redfield Depot

**ANOTHER TRAIL STORY** – Al Carmichael was the volunteer staff person at the Depot one Saturday morning early in June. He looked out and saw someone coming who was pushing a stroller. He assumed the man had a baby in there who was being taken for a walk. Later, as he visited with the “pusher” in the Depot he heard how the man, Martin, from Switzerland, was walking across America from East to West, carrying his supplies in the stroller. They had a good conversation and he went on his way – toward his destination for the night, Panora.

Martin wrote in the Guest Book that he was travelling on the American Discovery Trail. Some research on that “trail” reveals that it is a collection of non-motorized trails which can be hiked, biked and in some cases ridden astride a horse. Since the priority is “no motors”, it is by no means a direct route – the whole trail across the USA from East to West is 6,800 miles. The Iowa section is a total of 512 miles from Davenport to Council Bluffs. The Raccoon River Valley Trail is listed as part of the ADT between Clive and Herndon.

**“PICKING” ALONG THE TRAIL** – This is the time of year when trail users find interesting – and useful vegetation along the trail. Have you ever used your helmet to collect berries? ## **Redfield City Council**

### **June 7<sup>th</sup>, 2016**

The Redfield City Council met in regular session on Tuesday, June 7, 2016. Mayor Lantz called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. Present were councilmembers Hoy, Bowman, Godwin-Pote, DeZeeuw, and Danielson, Attorney Stewart and Clerk Light.

DeZeeuw made a motion and Hoy seconded to approve the agenda with the addition of Appointment of Zoning Administrator under the Zoning Report. Roll call vote – all ayes.

Discussion was held regarding a few of the bills. Hoy moved and Danielson seconded to approve the Consent Agenda which included the minutes of the previous meetings, claims paid, Library report, Cigarette Permit for Casey's General Store, and outdoor service area for Offside's Pizza & Pub, L.L.C. for both the Bacon Ride and Old Settler's. Roll call vote – all ayes. The council decided to drop the cleaning service for City Hall back to \$35 weekly.

Zoning Administrator Eide reported two permits were issued, one for a new home at 1505 Jefferson Street and a shed at 1316 Thomas Street. Two permits are outstanding, none were denied.

Mayor Lantz thanked Eide and presented him with a Certificate of Appreciation for his six years of service as the city's Zoning Administrator. Tim Flanigan was appointed by the Mayor to take over the position.

Fire Chief Short reported two calls for the month with six man-hours. The EMS did not have a report nor was anyone present.

Deputy Sanchez was present, said there were still no stats due to the new system.

Ken Hurt visited with the council about a piece of equipment at the park that needs repaired and asked if a new balance board station could be placed in the park near the balance beam on the south side. Hurt said if permissible, the Redfield Development Corporation would purchase. Hoy moved to approve adding the new piece of playground equipment, Godwin-Pote seconded the motion. Roll call vote – all ayes.

Public Works Director Danielson reported that the painting and cleaning of the tank is scheduled for July and he is checking on a mixer that will improve the freshness of the water in the tank, approximate cost \$30,000. AccuJet was out to televise the sewer on Clark and Jefferson and other areas of town showing no problems. Blacktop Services will be in town next Monday to start on street projects. The public works department has also filled holes with cold patch around town. Council member Danielson asked why the street is in such bad shape on Third Street between Thomas and Taylor? Danielson explained that a lot of water comes down the alley there and goes into the intake. The sidewalk to Casey's is delayed two to three weeks. Demo on the house at 626 Grant Street has begun and should be finished up this week. Bleachers in the park are getting painted, grass has been sprayed for weeds and landscaping has been done. Godwin-Pote asked Danielson to call Ganoe Excavating to clean out the mud volleyball pit for us for Old Settler's.

Danielson met with County Roads on a complaint received from a resident at 31763 Division Street regarding mowing of her ditch and complaints about her dead-end road. One path on each side of the ditch will be mowed from now on as the homeowner is responsible for maintaining the rest.

Mayor Lantz said he attended a recent Mayor's meeting. Discussion was held about the Redfield Development helping residents spruce up property, mow, etc. The clerk will contact one resident to see if help is needed.

Nuisances were discussed and a short recess was taken at 8:15 p.m. The city will move forward with the abatement at 1405 Thomas, junk cars need moved and also access needs to be available at all times since there is an easement on the property. The clerk set up asbestos inspections on 517 Third Street and 1206 First Street for Friday morning. A letter will be sent to 812 Clark Street regarding several cars parked in the parking and yard. A letter to 1415 Jefferson referencing a junk car on the parking with flat tires and truck parked at Clark & Jefferson near the stop sign.

Street closures during Bacon Ride on the 18<sup>th</sup> and Old Settler's the next weekend were discussed, portable toilets were ordered as well as dumpsters. Danielson moved to approve the street closures, DeZeeuw seconded. Roll call vote – all ayes.

Danielson made a motion to approve Resolution 2016-09, a Resolution to Transfer funds to cover debt service payments and to zero and close out old funds. Godwin-Pote seconded the motion. Roll call vote – all ayes.

DeZeeuw moved that the meeting adjourn, Danielson seconded. Meeting adjourned.




