Redfield Clinic News

Cell phone use and brain cancer: A recent study of rats exposed to cell phone radiation reported an increase in brain cancer (gliomas) in male rats. However cell phones have been widely used since the 1980s with no increase in brain cancer in people. By far the main risk with cell phones is distracted driving.

Hearing loss: the main signs of hearing loss are difficulty hearing when multiple people are talking in a room, having to turn up TV or radio to hear and needing to ask people to repeat what they said frequently. Preventing hearing loss by using hearing protection when in a noisy environment is best.

For poison ivy prevention remember plants with "leaves of three leave them be." Poison ivy grows most everywhere in Iowa except in mature, well shaded forests. Occurring in both bush and vine form poison ivy causes an intensely itchy, blistering rash that can persist for weeks in the 80% of us who react to it. Pictures of the plant can be googled. Washing off the skin with soap and water, and rubbing alcohol within 20 minutes of exposure and applying hydrocortisone cream can prevent the rash.

Preventing allergies due to pollen: Doing the following can help – changing clothes and showering promptly on coming inside, using air conditioning, wearing a pollen mask while working outside, using the dryer instead of hanging clothes outside, wiping down pets before letting them inside and using over the counter anti-allergy nasal sprays and anti-histamines as recommended by your medical care provider.

Proposed restrictive medical rules that would increase costs and decrease access to care have been delayed but are still under consideration.

Thank you to all who helped delay these unneeded additional regulation. Stay tuned.

Trail Stories – One of the benefits of volunteering at the Depot is interacting with the trail users who are in and out. Their ride today, where they are from and their biking stories are great topics of conversation. They enjoy the attractive outdoor space and shady picnic tables. Inside, they appreciate the convenient restroom, the quick and easy availability of the Depot – offering cold drinks, snacks – and the ever popular homemade cookies for which the Redfield Depot is famous! (And very often with the purchase of a 25 cent cookie or two, we hear something like, 'Keep the change, and thanks for being here.')

Several of us have talked to the lady who actually moved back to Waukee from the Marshalltown area where she thought she was going to relocate. She missed the RRVT and the rides she was able to take easily from her home. She particularly likes the Redfield stop, and has a collection of every year's t-shirts accumulated from her many visits here.

I met a couple of 40ish age guys who had ridden out from Des Moines together as they often did. In chatting with them, they told me they had met at one of the Iowa caucuses a few years before. One of them, an Iowan, lived in Des Moines and his 'now-friend' was a resident of Washington DC. The guy from the East has become interested in maybe moving to Iowa through his experience during the caucuses – the people he met and the lifestyle here. They kept in touch and the DC man and his family eventually made the move. He found a job in downtown Des Moines, and a home for his family in the Beavertdale area. Listening to him compare his previous situation to the present one was entertaining. He said they couldn't believe they found such a great place to live – reasonably priced, with a short commute to work – an impossibility in DC. They enjoyed their yard, and a great neighborhood where at night it was quiet enough so that stepping out the back door they could hear the symphony of frogs and night insects under the star filled sky. He compared the morning traffic reports in both places. In DSM, as he was preparing to drive to work, he was warned that traffic was a little slow from the west mix-master and might result in an extra ten minutes getting to work. In DC it might be something like a bomb threat on the Expressway, necessitating a detour to get downtown to work and might result in a delay of a few hours!

Redfield City Council

May 3rd, 2016

The Redfield City Council met in regular session on Tuesday, May 3, 2016. Mayor Lantz called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. Present were council members Hoy, Bowman, Godwin-Pote, DeZeeuw and Danielson, Attorney Stewart, and Clerk Light.

Bowman moved and Danielson seconded to approve the agenda with two additions, set date for workshop on the City Code under Old Business and add Resolution 2016-06, a Resolution of Intent to Sell Property under New Business. Roll call vote – all ayes.

After discussion on the bills, Hoy moved and Godwin-Pote seconded to approve the consent agenda which included the minutes of the previous meeting, claims paid, and the Library report. Roll call vote – all ayes.

Zoning Administrator Eide reported three permits were issued, two, for single family homes and one fence permit. He has two permits outstanding. Bowman explained that the committee for deciding on a new Zoning Administrator met before the meeting. Bowman made a motion, Hoy seconded to select Dale Eklov for the position, he was a former Mayor, is retired, and has built many homes. Roll call vote – Hoy and Bowman, yes, Godwin-Pote, DeZeeuw, and Danielson voted no. Motion failed. Danielson said she thought candidates were to come to the April meeting if interested and Eklov did not. Bowman said the second choice was Tim Flanagan but he has not yet moved to town, he owns two homes but is not yet a resident. Mayor Lantz will talk with both candidates before the next meeting and will make a recommendation at the June meeting.

Fire Chief Short, was absent but reported seven calls for the department with 70.25 man-hours.

The Redfield EMS did not have a report.

Dan Rittel, Grand Army of the Republic Highway Officer, spoke to the council about the G.A.R. Highway sign project. The goal is to remark U.S. Highway 6 across Iowa. Eight signs have been ordered from the DOT for this project and the city will pay for two to help with the cost.

Cate Bryan, Dallas County Auditor candidate, running in the next election introduced herself to the council and mayor.

Sargent Bowers attended the meeting. A police report is not available this month because the Sheriff's Office is getting a new system installed. Bowers mentioned Sanchez was well over the normal patrol time for the month in Redfield.

Godwin-Pote made a motion to open the Public Hearing on the Budget Amendment, DeZeeuw seconded the motion. Discussion was held. There were no comments from the audience nor were any written comments received. Danielson moved and Hoy seconded to close the Public Hearing. Roll call vote – all ayes.

Greg Comer asked the council if they would like to purchase an aerial photo of the city. Mayor Lantz said we would discuss later and get back to him.

Jenny York introduced herself to the council and talked about a 600 square foot house that she is planning to build. York made an offer on a lot in town but a public hearing will need to be held before the property can be sold. Changing the address of a lot was discussed but should be no problem.

Public Works Director Danielson reported Jetco is still on for cleaning the tower, no date yet. Trees from Second Street were moved to the area by the dam. Hydrants were flushed during April. Part-time seasonal help was discussed. The committee decided to hire Dave Griffith, 20 hours per week at \$11.00 per hour. DeZeeuw made a motion and Godwin-Pote seconded. Roll call vote – all ayes.

Mayor Lantz proclaimed Poppy Day as May 21st in the City of Redfield.

Mayor Lantz spoke about an article in the Register regarding the Mayors of Dallas County pushing to get two more elected officials on the county's Board of Supervisors. Mayor Lantz has not signed the letter in favor of the increase but he will attend a meeting on May 10th when the Mayors will meet with the Supervisors to discuss further.

Nuisance properties were discussed. Progress has been made at 1112 Grant Street, 1405 Thomas Street, 626 Third Street, and 1216 Jackson Street, will wait till June meeting to revisit those. Bowman moved and Hoy seconded to move forward on the abatement of 517 Third Street. Roll call vote – Hoy, Bowman, Godwin-Pote, DeZeeuw, all ayes. Danielson, nay. Motion carried. The house at 626 Grant Street is ready to be demolished. Progress has been made at 529 Third Street but will go ahead and resend notice via certified mail. Will discuss 1206 First Street property at special meeting on May 17th since we did not hear from the homeowner.

A special meeting will be held on May 17th at 6 p.m. Notice of Public Hearing on Intent to Sell Property located at 1505 Jefferson Street will be on the agenda with a workshop on the Redfield City Code to follow.

Godwin-Pote asked for a donation to the WCV Run Club for the Hanging Rock Run on Saturday morning of Old Settlers. Bowman moved and DeZeeuw seconded to donate \$50. Roll call vote – Hoy, Bowman, DeZeeuw, Danielson, all ayes. Godwin-Pote, abstained. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Bowman and seconded by Danielson to approve Resolution 2016-05, Amendment of the Current City Budget. Roll call vote – all ayes. Bowman moved that the meeting adjourn, Hoy seconded. Meeting adjourned.

Redfield City Council

May 17th, 2016

The Redfield City Council met in special session on Tuesday, May 17th, 2016, at 6pm for a Public Hearing of Intent to Sell Property. Mayor Lantz called the meeting to order, present were council members Hoy, Danielson, DeZeeuw and Bowman, Attorney Stewart and Clerk Light. Godwin-Pote arrived shortly after the Public Hearing closed.

Hoy moved and Danielson seconded to open the public hearing regarding the intent to sell a property by sealed bid at 1505 Jefferson Street. Mayor Lantz asked if there were any written comments received. None were received. Nor were there any oral comments. One sealed bid of \$5,000 was received from Jenny York. The property will be sold as is, subject to any easements apparent or of record, with the buyers will be responsible to pay for the abstracting, the taxes will be prorated to date of purchase, and the City shall convey by quit claim deed, upon receipt of the entire purchase price.

Bowman moved and Hoy seconded to close the public hearing. Roll call vote – all ayes.

Danielson made a motion to approve Resolution 2016-17, a Resolution of Intent to Accept Offer to Purchase Real Property and set a date for a Public Hearing on May 31st, 2016, at 6pm. DeZeeuw seconded the motion. Roll call vote – all ayes.

Bowman moved that the meeting adjourn, Hoy seconded. Meeting adjourned.

A workshop to review the City Code was held after the meeting.
