

Redfield Clinic News

Flu immunization: Flu vaccinations will be available in September at the Redfield Clinic. Flu immunizations are recommended for all. Benefits are cumulative, especially for those with heart disease. FluMist, the nasal spray flu immunization, is no longer recommended.

Skin cancer is the most common cancer in the United States. One in five people in America will develop it in their lifetime. Most skin cancers will occur on the head and face. 9,000 Americans will die of the most serious kind of skin cancer, malignant melanoma. Sun screen, covering up exposed skin and avoiding excessive sun exposure during the hottest time of the day can reduce skin cancers.

Restrictive rules still threaten medical care: Despite the Iowa legislature's requirement that PA rules be jointly adopted by the PA Board and the Iowa Medical Board, the Medical Board is trying to enforce unilateral, unneeded and costly regulations. Most importantly, no evidence has been provided that additional rules are needed.

Unfortunately, a small town's only medical clinic has closed in Baxter, IA (population 1,100). Because of these burdensome rules using the PA option for keeping the Baxter medical clinic open like Redfield did is most unlikely due to the costly and restrictive regulations. Both the University of Iowa and the national PA Association have estimated that the cost of these extra regulations will be \$3-5 million yearly. This huge cost far outweighs any reduction in the number of physician visits required for PA staffed small town clinics. Your state legislators are Representative Ralph Watts (ralph.watts@legis.ia.gov) and Senator Jake Chapman (jake.chapman@legis.ia.gov). Their address is Statehouse, Des Moines, IA 50319.

Redfield City Council

August 2nd, 2016

The Redfield City Council met on Tuesday, August 2, 2016. Mayor Lantz called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. Present were council members Hoy, DeZeeuw, Godwin-Pote, and Danielson, Attorney Stewart and Clerk Light. Bowman was absent.

Danielson asked to add under New Business a complaint received on social media regarding the Library. Danielson moved and Hoy seconded to approve the agenda with the one addition. Roll call vote – all ayes.

Hoy moved and Godwin-Pote seconded to approve the consent agenda which included the minutes of the previous meeting, July claims paid, and the Library report. Roll call vote – all ayes.

Zoning Administrator Tim Flanigan reported one permit was issued for a storage unit and one permit is still outstanding. Changing addresses on lots was also discussed.

Mason Cave reported for the Fire Department, two calls with seven man-hours.

Teresa Nolan reported for the EMS, eight calls in Redfield and one call in Linden.

Deputy Sanchez reported that the reports from the Sheriff's office are not ready yet but he kept track of his own time reporting 3,890 minutes of patrol time in the city limits. He responded to 15 calls, had one arrest, two warnings were issued and wrote one citation.

There were no visitors present.

Public Works Director Danielson reported that Jetco reprogrammed the water plant and chemical feed pumps and will do a test run on the tower Thursday. The sidewalk to Casey's should be finished by the end of the week. Hoy Concrete should be here to do the sidewalks uptown around the 15th of August. Mayor Lantz said to give a heads up to business owners. Wisecup is waiting for parts to fix his backhoe

then will move on to demolition at 1206 First Street.

Dallas County Habitat for Humanity will be in town August 10-13. They are still needing volunteers to help with projects.

Nuisances were discussed, several are working on cleanup of property and we will review next month. Next year, make and model of junk vehicles before removing from property. Hoy moved and DeZeeuw seconded to designate Mayor Lantz to issue notice of abatement to 1405 Thomas Street for two vehicles to be towed. Roll call vote – all ayes.

A Notice to abate will be sent to resident at 712 First Street to clean up a pile of burned wood and debris. The city will move forward with abating new owner of 517 Third Street. The Clerk will send letter to the owner of 1305 Grant Street to get the yard mowed.

DeZeeuw mentioned putting a flyer from Teen Challenge, a vehicle donation center, in with the letters.

They recently did this with a car and will get a tax deduction on next year's taxes. Clerk Light will check into it. The clerk received a complaint regarding a sidewalk needing repair at 1315 Jefferson Street, the resident also has some junk vehicles sitting around that need to be addressed. The council will move forward with cleanup of the property at 529 Third, a trailer was brought in but debris is still cluttering the driveway and around the entire property.

Mayor Lantz will do employee evaluations and report back at the September 6th meeting.

Danielson reported that she spoke with the Library Board and Librarian at the board meeting on Monday night regarding a complaint about the library. Clerk Light will ask for a copy of the bylaws.

DeZeeuw moved to adjourn the meeting, Godwin-Pote seconded. Meeting adjourned.






